Tammy Roberts

Congratulating Ms. Tammy Roberts, a long-time northern resident who moved to Yellowknife in 1993 from northern Manitoba with her two young children. Since moving to Yellowknife, Ms. Roberts has dedicated her heart and home to children and youth in foster care from across the Northwest Territories. Nominated for her contributions in the **non-profit sector**. For more than 20 years, she led initiatives in programing, education, resources, and supports, advocating for the health and safety of vulnerable children and youth. Known for her compassion and commitment, Ms. Roberts has made significant contributions to the wellbeing of children and youth through the Foster Family Coalition of the NWT and Home Base Yellowknife. She was awarded the Queen Elizabeth II Golden Jubilee Medal, a Wise Women Award and the King Charles III Coronation Award for her exceptional work supporting homeless youth in the Northwest Territories.

David Hurley

Congratulating Mr. David Hurley, a long-time northern resident who moved to the Northwest Territories in the 1970's from Newfoundland. Nominated for his contributions in **volunteer services**. Through his volunteer efforts in sports and recreation, Mr. Hurley has been instrumental in shaping the Sport North organization, which has benefited youth and athletes across the north by promoting and developing sport programs. Mr. Hurley is also recognized for his commitment to help alleviate poverty by forming the Habitat for Humanity chapter of the NWT, which has helped house families across the NWT and become first time homeowners. Mr. Hurley also has an extensive list of awards that have been bestowed upon him for his outstanding volunteerism, such as Terry Petkau Legacy Award for Outstanding Volunteer, NWT Habitat Volunteer of the Year Award, Outstanding Volunteer Award from the City of Yellowknife and has been inducted into the NWT Sports Hall of Fame.
