




Why is GNWT Evolving the Exploration and Mining Administration Legislation?

Sustainable Mining Governance

Intergovernmental Form (IGF) Mining Policy Framework – identifies good practices required for good environmental, social and economic governance of the mining sector





NWT Mining Regulations – focused on 2 key areas



 Regulations specific to small scale operators

MRA – focuses regulation development improvements in 4 key areas for a sustainable mining sector





What are the Specific Mineral Resources Act (MRA) Improvements?

Benefits of the *MRA* coming-into-force **Improved Mining Sector**



Increased opportunities for relationship building through knowledge sharing



Increased publicly available technical information



Increased transparency with Public Registry



Increased tools for companies to managing tenure



Mandatory benefits requirements to occur with production



Increased monitoring of Production



Increased access to exploration rights with online map staking



How are MRA Regulations Being Created?

Overall Legislative Approach for MRA

MRA Regulations: Implementation of the Regulations

Development of the regulations is only part of the necessary work to be able to come into force with the MRA

Need to resource areas where new responsibilities are obtained

Develop new business rules

Update software to implement new business rules (i.e. the Mineral Administration and Registry System)

Develop external guidance documents

Prepare proponents of the changes in managing their mineral interests



Royalties updated Regulations



Mirrored copy of Royalty Regulations on track for coming in force (2027)



Currently ITI is engaging on the proposed changes to the Royalties framework and allowances and deductions



Following engagement a draft policy intentions document will be created



Regulations will be drafted thereafter

Regulation amendments for updated map tools (Online map staking, Zones and Temporary Restricted Areas) – phase 2


Currently developing policy intentions for enhanced map tools and integration of these tools into the regulations

Contracting for the system changes required to update these tools is currently in progress

These regulations will be developed after general regulations are complete
