Landscape

- Community Health Nurses (CHNs) are the primary care providers in most NWT communities.
- 19 Community Health Centers + 9 Health Cabins

Drivers

- National nurse shortage
- Chronic Community Health Nurse vacancies in community health centres
- Reduction of services
- Need for sustainable, flexible models of care

Process

- Brainstorming sessions:
 - Key themes:
 - Licensed Practical Nurses
 - Paramedics
 - Enablers: Virtual Care & Nurse Practitioners

Process

- Data collection:
 - Service reduction letters
 - Jurisdictional scans
 - Meetings with Jurisdictional leaders
 - Environmental scans

Results

- CHN led model of care continues
- LPNs and Paramedics have been used in some health centres
 - Need for standardization
- Data limitations
- Next steps: formalize roles, standards/policies, and supports

Recommendations

Five recommendations:

- 1. Conduct a current state in depth analysis of LPN use in the NWT.
- 2. Conduct a current state in depth analysis of paramedic use in the NWT.
- 3. Identify opportunities to implement LPNs and paramedics to support programs and services while assessing the possible of expanding their services with additional training.
- 4. Transition the NWT Community Health Nursing Administration Policies and Guidelines into standards and implementing a monitoring and reporting framework, and
- 5. Assessing areas for further investment in support of CHN model of care, through appropriate ways such as education, training and support.
