# What is an International Educated Nurse?

- Nursing Education completed outside Canada Differences in:
  - Education and clinical experience
  - Cultural norms and scope of practice
  - Language and communication
- Integration requires planning and support

# Public Concern and Our Response

- Public told us: IENs in the NWT want to work as nurses but face barriers
- We acted:
  - We reviewed legislation and regulatory requirements
  - Engaged the Joint Territorial Nursing Council
  - Launched a working group and survey to understand the issue

## What We Learned from Other Jurisdictions

- Common supports elsewhere:
  - Supervised practice programs
  - Bridging education programs
  - Tailored orientation and onboarding
- These require significant resources and long-term commitment

## Pathways – Current and Alternatives

Pathway	What it is	Why it's Hard in NWT
Supervised Practice	Clinical hours under RN supervision	High cost, staffing shortages
Bridge-in Program	Education + Practicum	Limited college& HSS capacity
Current NWT Pathway	Practice hours elsewhere OR Inspire Assessment	May require travel for some



# Territorial IEN Working Group

- Established by the Joint Territorial Nursing Council to:
  - Gather data on IENs in the NWT
  - Identify barriers
  - Develop recommendations
- Survey completed April-May 2025
- Results and recommendations expected early 2026



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
