# First Reading of Bills

Bill 15: Northwest Territories Indigenous-Led Conservation Fund Establishment Act

Introduced by the Minister of Environment and Climate Change.

In accordance with Rule 8.2(3), the Speaker deemed Bill 15 read for the first time and ready for second reading.

# Second Reading of Bills

The Minister of Environment and Climate Change sought and received consent to proceed with second reading of Bill 15, Northwest Territories Indigenous-Led Conservation Fund Establishment Act.

Bill 15: Northwest Territories Indigenous-Led Conservation Fund Establishment Act

Introduced by the Minister of Enviornment and Climate Change.

The Honourable Member for Thebacha, seconded by the Honourable Member for Hay River North, moved that Bill 15, *Northwest Territories Indigenous-Led Conservation Fund Establishment Act*, be read for the second time.

The motion was CARRIED.

The Minister of Environment and Climate Change sought and received unanimous consent to waive Rule 8.2(7) and have Bill 15 referred directly to Committee of the Whole for consideration later today.
